▪ CENTRAL

Butterfield Nature Reserves

Point Shares Road, Pembroke
Tel:(441) 236-6483

This nature reserve located on Point Shares was donated by Mr Dudley G. Butterfield. The wooded hillside has a trail through almost pure Bermuda palmetto forest with examples of the rare Bermuda sedge. The southern end of the reserve consists of a banana patch and short trail through mixed palms.
Open: Dawn till dusk. Free entry.

Garrison Cemetery, Prospect

Greenwich Lane, off Alexandra Road, Fort Hill, from Middle Road,
Devonshire

This was the cemetery for the British Army in the 19th and 20th centuries when Prospect Barracks housed the British garrison and more recently became the police cemetery. There are fine examples of classic tombstone masonry, including the final resting place of Governor Sir Walter Kitchener. Free entry.

Waterville

This eighteenth century house is headquarters to the Bermuda National Trust. There are two public rooms featuring Victorian furnishings.
Open: Mon–Fri 9am–5pm. Free entry.

Verdmont House Museum

6 Verdmont Lane, off Collector's Hill, Smith's Parish

An historic 18th century house surrounded by lovely gardens. Features unique collections of Bermuda cedar furniture, Chinese and English porcelain, and portraits by Blackburne and John Green.

Warwick Pond

Olivebank Drive, Warwick

This 9-acre reserve is the second largest freshwater pond in Bermuda and is a sanctuary for resident and migratory waterfowl. There is an extensive woodland bordering the Warwick Railway Trail, with large allspice trees and Bermuda cedars. The nature trail around the pond is signed.

Open: Dawn till dusk. Free entry.

▪ EAST END

The Bermuda National Trust Museum at the Globe Hotel

The Museum features a video presentation tracing the early history of the Islands and an exhibition which explores Bermuda's role in the American Civil War (1861-64). Also houses the Museum shop.

Convict Cemetery, Ireland Island

At the west end of Cochrane Road, off Malabar Road, Ireland Island on the approach to the RN Dockyard

This cemetery served as a burial ground for convicts who served as labourers on the British fortifications. Of the 9,000 convicts sent to Bermuda, 2000 died. There are only 13 marked graves, four named and nine unnamed. Free entry.

Ferry Reach Military Cemeteries

Ferry Reach Park, St George's Parish

These British military cemeteries have graves from the yellow fever epidemic in the 1860's. The first is a small walled cemetery by the house at Ferry Point and the second is just off the Railway Trail overlooking the North Shore.

Idwal Hughes Nature Reserve

Walsingham, Harrington South Road, Hamilton Parish

This 1.25 acres of woodland is part of the larger wilderness area of Walsingham, also known as "Tom Moore's Jungle". The forest and cave system provide challenging walks and make an adventurous area for exploring. Access is from the road leading to Tom Moore's Tavern. Access to Walsingham may also be gained through Blue Hole Park. Open: dawn till dusk. Free entry.

St George's Military Cemeteries, St George's Parish

Grenadier Lane and Secretary Road, North Shore, St George's

These cemeteries were the final resting place of many yellow fever victims of the 19th century. To the west of Military Cemetery on Secretary Road is a notable monumental sculpture. The Victoria Cross winner George Sampson of the Royal Naval Reserve is interred here. Older military graves are included in the Secretary Road cemeteries. Free entry.

Tucker House

5 Water St, St George's

This traditional 18th century Bermuda house was the home of one of Bermuda's leading families during the American Revolution and Napoleonic Wars. Features include portraits, furnishings, porcelain, silver and an archaeological exhibit (artefacts found on-site).

Royal Naval Cemetery, Ireland Island

Malabar Road, Ireland Island on the approach to the RN Dockyard

Also known as 'The Glade', this cemetery holds memorials to Royal Naval personnel who died of yellow fever during the mid 19th century. It also records many accidents that occurred to young servicemen in Bermuda. Free entry.

Somerset Military Cemetery, Somerset

Off Mangrove Bay Road, west of Watford Bridge behind bus stop

This cemetery contains 13 Commonwealth graves from WW1. Among them are West Indians, Canadians and three Bermudians who died of

accidental injuries in 1915. The cemetery was consecrated in 1903 and the latest memorial is dated 1918. Free entry.

The Old Rectory

1 Broad Alley, behind St Peter's Church, St George's

An early 18th century house set in an English cottage-style country garden. Open: Nov-Mar only, Wed 1pm-5pm. Free entry

Unfinished Church

Head of Duke of Kent Street, St George's

Tel: (441) 236-6483

Magnificent Gothic structure started in the 1870's to replace St Peter's Church. Abandoned on the eve of completion it is now a picturesque ruin. Entry free.

Watford Cemetery, Somerset

On the right of the Royal Naval Dockyard after crossing Watford Bridge at the end of a footpath from the carpark.

This cemetery contains memorials to soldiers and their families from 1853-1899. There are graves from many different regiments and convicts were buried from 1849 in unconsecrated ground. There are also graves from the 1864 yellow fever epidemic. Free entry.

▪ WEST END

Buckingham

Historic house with Antique Garden store stocked with an electric array of items, including vintage linen, artwork, china, furniture, lamps and collectibles.

Gilbert Nature Reserve & Springfield

Springfield, 29 Somerset Road, Somerset

Tel: (441) 236-6483

The reserve consists of 5 acres of woodland and paths connected to Railway Trail. There are magnificent examples of Bermuda cedars and the area offers excellent bird watching. Adjacent to the reserve is the property of Springfield, and excellent example of plantation-style Bermudian architecture. Springfield houses the Sandys Community Centre.

Open: Dawn till dusk. Admission to the ground free.

Gladys Morrell Nature Reserve

East Shore Road, Somerset

The Reserve is an ideal place to walk and is the natural nesting area for the Bermuda bluebird.

Open: Dawn till dusk. Free entry.

Paget Marsh Nature Reserve

Lovers Lane, Paget

A peat marsh with boardwalk access into the centre of Bermuda's largest cedar and palmetto forest (25 acres) with interpretive signs.

Open: Dawn till dusk. Free entry.

Palm Island

Ely's Harbour, Sandys

The picturesque areas of Palm Island and Morgan's Island were donated in 1983 by the Ingersoll family. The two islands are reserves for birds and other important wildlife.

Open: Palm Island during daylight hours; Morgan's Island need permission from Trust.

Scaur Lodge Nature Reserve and Farmland

Scaur Lane, off Somerset Road, Sandys

6.06 acres of woodland and farmland located near Fort Scaur. The trail off Scaur Lane leads to a view over Ely's Harbour.

Open: Dawn till dusk. Free entry.

Stewart Hall

Bermuda Perfumery - shop and scented garden.

Spittal Pond

South Road, Smith's

Bermuda's most impressive area of open space, this 64-acre reserve boasts magnificent coastal views.

Open: Dawn till dusk. Free entry

Warwick Pond Nature Reserve

Interpretive trail over 9 acres, dominated by scenic pond and woodland.

Open: Dawn till dusk. Free entry.
