The house has no electric light.

This rocky island is connected to the cliffs by a rope bridge and offers an exhilarating coast path experience. The site is unique for its geology, flora and fauna and has wonderful bird watching. There is a tearoom and children's discovery trail.

An 18th century thatched cottage built by Isaac Cory, who represented Newry in the Irish House of Commons for 30 years. Picturesque parkland with fine views.

▪ BELFAST

Divis and Black Mountain

With spectacular panoramic views over Belfast, the recently acquired Divis and the Black Mountain is a haven for those seeking the wild countryside experience. It is a 1,500 acre mosaic of upland heath and blanket bog – home to a wealth of flora and fauna. On a clear day there are views of Strangford Lough, the Mourne and the Sperrins, as well as Scotland and Donegal.

▪ CO. FERMANAGH

Castle Coole is one of the finest neo-classical houses in Ireland, built by James Wyatt in the late 18th century. The guided tour shows the opulent Regency interior decoration, furnishings and furniture, the state bedroom prepared for George IV in 1821 and the elegant hall where evening concerts are often held. The nearby servants' tunnel, stable yard and ice house are set within a stunning landscape park ideal for long walks. Programme of fine musical evenings and family days.

Crom Estate

A fine 18th century house and estate set against the stunning backdrop of the Cuilcagh Mountains. It was the home of the Earls of Enniskillen and is one of the most important houses in Ulster. There are extensive walks in the grounds, also a sawmill, holiday cottage, walled garden and programme of concerts, family days, guided walks and country fairs.

Mussenden Temple and Downhill Demesne

Set on a stunning and wild headland with fabulous clifftop walks and views over Ireland's north coast is the landscaped estate of Downhill, laid out in the late 18th century by the eccentric Earl and Bishop, Frederick Hervey. Estate includes ruins, mausoleum, and beautiful gardens. Mussenden Temple is perched on the cliff edge.

A 17th century thatched house with a cruck-truss roof construction.

There are waymarked paths in the estate.
