An 18th century house on the Menai Strait displaying Whistler's largest painting, and an exhibition about his work. A military museum houses relics of the 1st Marquess of Anglesey. There is also a spring garden and an Australasian arboretum.

A traditional Carmarthenshire farmhouse in an unspoilt setting providing a rare insight into an aspect of agricultural life. Public footpaths give access to the surrounding land. Entry to the farmhouse is by guided tour only and must be booked in advance.

An 18th century landscape park surrounding Newton House with its Victorian Gothic facade.

Dolaucothi Gold Mines

These unique gold mines are set amid wooded hillsides overlooking the beautiful Cothi Valley. The Romans who exploited the site almost 2000 years ago left behind a complex of pits, channels, adits and tanks. Mining resumed in the 19th century and continued through to the 20th century, reaching a peak in 1938. Guided tours take visitors through the Roman and the more recent underground workings (reduced fee for NT members).

▪ **CEREDIGION**

A rare survivor of a Welsh gentry estate, the principle house built in 1794–6. Set in the beautiful Aeron Valley with extensive estate and parkland walks.

Aberconwy House

Designed and built by Thomas Telford, this elegant suspension bridge was completed in 1826. The toll-keeper's house has recently been restored and furnished as it would have been a century ago

Ty Mawr Wybrnant

Birthplace of Bishop William Morgan. The house has been restored to its probable 16/17th century appearance.

▪ GWYNEDD

Penrhyn Castle

This neo-Norman fantasy castle sits between Snowdonia and the Menai Strait. Built by Thomas Hopper between 1820 and 1845 for the wealthy Pennant family, who made their fortune from Jamaican sugar and Welsh slate, the castle is crammed with fascinating things such as a one-ton slate bed made for Queen Victoria. The stable block houses an industrial railway museum, a countryside exhibition, a railway model museum and a superb dolls museum displaying a large collection of 19th- and 20th-century dolls. The 18.2ha (45 acres) of grounds include parkland, an extensive exotic tree and shrub collection and a Victorian walled garden

Plas Yn Rhiw

A small manor house with lovely grounds down to the sea. The house is part-medieval with Tudor and Georgian additions.

Segontium

These remains of a Roman fort are a World Heritage site located on the outskirts of Caernarfon. There is museum containing relics found on the site. NT members may be charged for entry to the museum.

Skenfrith Castle

These remains of an early 13th century fortress built beside the River Monnow once commanded one of the main routes from England to Wales. The fortress includes a keep and curtain wall with towers.

▪ MONMOUTHSHIRE

A two-storey circular Georgian banqueting house and naval temple. The hilltop grounds offer spectacular views of the surrounding countryside.

▪ NEATH & PORT TALBOT

For over 300 years this waterfall has provided energy to drive the wheels of industry. Today it houses a hydro-electric scheme.

▪ PEMBROKESHIRE

Iby Woodland Garden

St David's Peninsular

North and West of the tiny city of St David's within Pembrokeshire National Park

The National Trust owns and protects much of the picturesque and historic St David's Head and surrounding coastline. The Visitor Centre is situated in the centre of the city of St David's opposite The Cross (owned by the National Trust). The Visitor Centre offers a complete guide to The National Trust in Pembrokeshire, its properties, beaches and walks.

Stackpole

In the south of Pembrokeshire Coast National Park, between the villages of Stackpole and Bosherton

This beautiful stretch of coastline is famous for its sandy beaches, wooded valleys and lily ponds. The National Nature Reserve is a haven for wildlife such as the otter and chough. Pembrokeshire Coast Path offers lakeside and woodland walks. There are wonderful beaches and the area offers archaeology from prehistoric settlement to the 18th century. The area includes Barafundle Beach, Stackpole Quay, Bosherton Lakes, Stackpole Woodlands and coast paths to Trewent Point. Stackpole for Outdoor Learning is an educational eco centre and The Stackpole Centre has holiday accommodation.

▪ POWYS

Medieval castle built c.1200 by Welsh princes. The garden, is laid out under the influence of Italian and French styles. A beautiful collection of treasures from India is displayed in the Clive Museum Note: All visitors (inc. NT members) need to obtain a ticket from Visitor Reception in the main car park on arrival.

▪ SWANSEA

▪ WREXHAM

A magnificent Marcher fortress, completed in 1310. The rather austere exterior belies the comfortable and elegant state rooms inside, with elaborate plasterwork, superb Adam-style furniture, tapestries and portraits. In the formal gardens there are clipped yews, roses and a variety of flowering shrubs. After 400 years of occupation, the Myddelton family still live here

One of the most fascinating houses in Britain. The beautiful and evocative range of outbuildings includes kitchen, laundry, bakehouse, stables, sawmill, smithy and joiner's shop, while the stunning state rooms display most of their original 18th and 19th century furniture and furnishings, including some exquisite Chinese wallpaper. The large walled garden has been restored to its 18th-century formal design and has a Victorian parterre and yew walk. It also contains the National Collection of Ivies. There is an extensive park with woodland walks
